

Easter 5: The Sounds of the Resurrection

We cannot know the actual sounds of the Resurrection, but we know some of the sounds that followed soon after that event: a stone rolling; women speaking in shock and disbelief; the good news being shared; disciples doubting; Jesus entering a locked room; footsteps on the Emmaus road; a community worshipping and sharing. Through these sounds, we hear the voice of God.

The focus Scripture for this Sunday is John 14: 1-14. NRSV Updated Edition

Jesus the Way to the Father

14 "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me.² In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also.⁴ And you know the way to the place where I am going."⁵ Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?"⁶ Jesus said to him, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.⁷ If you know me, you will know¹ my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him."

⁸ Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." ⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰ Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own, but the Father who dwells in me does his works. ¹¹ Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, but if you do not, then believe^[e] because of the works themselves. ¹² Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³ I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.

How often have you heard the words "in my Father's house are many room" as the presiding minister or priest follows the casket of the deceased to the front of the sanctuary?

Did you realize that these are words of promise! In saying these words to his disciples, Jesus was promising them that he was going back to prepare places for them in the many rooms of his Father's house. These words too are one of the sounds of Resurrection!

As we come to the close of the Easter Season, I would like to share with you other words of Resurrection, perhaps easier to see and believe. They are attributed to Martin Luther**:

"Our Lord has written the promise of resurrection, not in books alone, but in every leaf in springtime."

Looking at the opening leaves outside my office window as I write this, my prayer for this week is:



Open us, loving God.

When we want to close our hearts, minds, and even our ears from the cries of others, from pleas for help and proclamations of justice, open us. Remove every stumbling block and enliven us with your spirit. Open us, we pray. Amen.
